This means the unborn babies will have physical abnormalities. At a function to create awareness about FAS, South Africa was found to have the worst incidence of FAS in the world. The Western Cape has at least four times more children affected than elsewhere in the world. It is estimated that one in ten children in Grade 1 in the Western Cape has FAS. Government officials also announced that 25% of pregnant women attending clinics are heavy drinkers.
