NATIONAL SENIOR CERTIFICATE

GRADE 12 LITERATURE 2014

The Department of Basic Education (DBE)'s Circular S3 of 2012 (Assessment Instruction 34 of 2012) and Circular S13 of 2013 communicated to schools that the Grade 12 literature for 2013 would be prescribed again for the 2014 National Senior Certificate examinations.

Circular S3 of 2012 communicated that a new list of prescribed literature for FET would be phased in over two years: novels and short stories in 2015, and drama and poetry in 2016.



In consultation with Provincial Curriculum Managers, DBE concluded on the following:

- Given the challenges faced by the DBE, all the outstanding FET genres will be implemented in 2016; and
- The Grade 12 Folklore will be implemented in 2015 as procurement is underway and delivery to schools will be finalized by end of October 2014.
- As stipulated in Circular S13 of 2013 (Attached as Annexure A) the status quo remains for the prescribed Grade 12 literature in public schools for the National Senior Certificate Examinations until November/ December 2015 and February/ March 2016.

The Department of Basic Education granting further extension for the use of the existing FET literature until 2015 and the implementation of Grade 12 Folklore in 2015.

Kindly bring the content of this Assessment Instruction to the attention of all schools and teachers involved.

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

CIRCULAR S13 OF 2013

PRESCRIBED POEMS FOR ALL OFFICIAL HOME LANGUAGES AND FIRST ADDITIONAL LANGUAGES AND SHORT STORIES FOR OFFICIAL FIRST AND SECOND ADDITIONAL LANGUAGES IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR THE NATIONAL SENIOR CERTIFICATE EXAMINATIONS IN NOVEMBER/DECEMBER 2014 – FEBRUARY/MARCH 2015

Prescribed poems for all official languages at Home Language level for the National Senior Certificate Examinations in November/December 2014 - February/March 2015

The NCS Grades R – 12 (Curriculum and Assessment Policy Statements [CAPS]) will be implemented throughout the education sector in the year 2014. As a result of the foregoing, all the concessions made in the education sector must be aligned to the NCS Grades R – 12 prescripts.

One such concession was retention of prescribed literature for Home Language (HL), First Additional Language (FAL) and Second Additional Language (SAL), which circulars **S8 of 2012**, **S2 of 2010** and **S2 of 2009** address.

With the implementation of CAPS in 2014, the concession creates an anomaly for poetry in the Home Languages as the CAPS prescribes 12 poems, as opposed to the 15 that the concession would retain.

With this circular, the Department of Basic Education (DBE) aligns the HL concessions stated in the cited circulars, to the CAPS prescripts. The list of twelve (12) poems retained for the National Senior Certificate Examinations November/December 2014 – February/March 2015 for each home language, is attached for your attention.

Please take note that the status quo remains for other genres in home languages.

Furthermore, circulars **S8 of 2012, S2 of 2010 and S2 of 2009** remain in force for all the **first additional languages for the National Senior Certificate Examinations in November/December 2014 - February/ March 2015.**


Grade 12 Literature networks and literature examination requirements for Official Second Additional Languages in the National Senior Certificate:

Please take note that candidates sitting for the National Senior Certificate Examinations, at Second Additional Language level, in November/December 2014 - February/ March 2015 will be required to write on two of the five short stories for 40 marks (2X20 – contextual questions on 2 short stories), as per the Curriculum and Assessment Policy Statements (CAPS) for official second additional languages. While Circular S8 of 2007 will still provide guidance to Provincial Education Departments on how to select and prescribe short stories for Second Additional Languages, the only amendment to Circular S8 of 2007 is that candidates will be tested on two of the five stories, instead of one as stated in Circular S8.

The literature part for the Second Additional Languages is still located in Section D of Paper 1: Language in context and Literature.

You are kindly requested to bring this information and the attached appendix to the attention of all schools, teachers and stakeholders involved in the teaching of languages in your province.


