The patient clearly misunderstands the request for a tissue sample and hands the nurse a used tissue. ✓ OR It was inappropriate to give the nurse a dirty tissue. ✓ OR The patient is being sarcastic. ✓ OR The patient is deliberately giving the nurse the wrong tissue sample. ✓ Yes, ✓ the nurse was not clear in the type of tissue sample she requested. ✓	2 marks awarded if the learner has replied yes or no with an appropriate explanation or validation.
